Menton

Situated at the extreme south east of France, Menton is all at once a city of gardens, a seaport and a beach resort. Roquebrune Cap Martin

The past reveals itself in the medieval village and castle, St. Marguerite's church, the ancient olive tree, the cave of Vallonet and Le Corbusier's cabin.

La Turbie

Looking over the Principality of Monaco, the whole of the commune is an immense viewpoint over the Mediterranean Sea. The view stretch as far as Italy to Cap Martin, Cap Ferrat, Cap de Nice, Antibes and finally the Esterel. The village has a lot of charm, with its narrow paved streets and vaulted passageways dating back to the Middle-Ages, tastefully restored houses and shady small squares.
